**Notes:** A Mr. and Mrs. Garnett came to Canada in the 1800's bringing their children with them. It is not clear how many children they had. One relative thought there were 18 and another didn't think there were as many. Supposedly, some of the children went to the United States and the rest stayed in Canada. The information gathered in this genealogy is from various sources including oral history, library research, internet census data bases using original and compiled data.

March 17, 1916, buried Port Hope Union Cemetery, Part M # 83, south side) Info taken from the CemSearch database: Emigrated from Great Oakley, near Harwick, Essex to Port Hope 1891 with her husband. They had 16 children, of which 12 were alive in 1916, including Thomas & William of Port Hope; Robert & Jonathan of New Zealand; Mrs. William Shaw, Mrs. Joseph Carruthers and Mrs. James Dench of Port Hope; Mrs. Henry Wallace of Rochester; and Mrs. Mills & Mrs. Duck of England. There were 48 grandchildren & 27 great-grandchildren at that time. Info from Evening Guide: Mrs. Garnett, 06 Sept 1830, Evening Guide, 19 Sept 1910, p 4, c 1, celebrating her 80<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Walter and Edna went to New York and got married in "The Little Church around the corner" and then returned to Port Hope where Walter set up practice. Lieut. HWA Zealand was listed on the Port Hope Honor Roll of the list of men who enlisted from Port Hope in the Great War, 1914-1918. One daughter.

She was also listed as a servant in the 1881 England Census living with the Berners at the Long Cross Private House, Chertsey, Surrey, England. There were a total of 6 servants and 1 governess. There were a Mrs. Mills and Mrs. Duck of England at the time of Susannah Cook's death in 1916 that were listed in her obit.
