On Lake Ontario, 63 miles east of Toronto, on King's Highway No. 2 at junction with No. 28 leading to the Kawartha Lakes district; population 4,700.

BAND—Citizens' Band; frequent concerts.

BATHING—Two beaches, dressing rooms at both; lifeguard (provided by Lions Club) at West Beach, except Mondays.

BADMINTON—Garrison Club and church clubs.

BOWLING—Lawn Bowling Club; bowling alleys.

CHURCHES—Two Anglican, one Baptist, one Presbyterian, one Roman Catholic, one United, Salvation Army.

CHILDREN'S AID—"Hillcrest Home."

CLUBS—Rotary, Lions and Port Hope Club. Home and School Association.

DANCING—Pavilion in Rotary Park.

ELECTRICITY—Hydro-Electric, municipally owned and free of debt; low rates.
